### BUGESERA PROJECT

The project at Nyamata/Ntarama continues to move forward. One house is now lived in and three more are nearly finished. There are now 1500 pineapple plants, 100 avocado trees, 50 papaya, 100 improved banana and 30 orange trees. The pineapples and peanuts have both produced income for the group already. Potatoes, which are not traditionally grown in this area have done amazingly well and have been harvested in three months from planting. ### STREET KIDS RESCUE PROJECT

The Street Kids/ Friends of Jesus continue to make great progress. After school they are now receiving help with homework from the project leaders and nearly all of them are now in the top quarter of their classes. It is wonderful to see them fulfil their potential. Although some of them still have a long way to go it is also great to see many helping in the church, singing in the choir and developing an increased godliness. This is what Mukashema Louise said: *"My father passed away in 2002. We were left with our mum and because we were in a hard time we went to pick charcoals (colloquial for looking in rubbish heaps). We met Emmanuel and he said "I will show you where you can get support". Junior brought us here and wrote down our names. When we came they taught us a good way to live and said "stay here and you can have a better life" They have helped us back into school and we thank pastor Paul that he has helped us to get back to school and get skills."*

**OUTREACH SUPPORT & RUKUMBERI**

As our partner Solace Ministries has grown it has struggled to keep responding to the cries of survivors asking for help. To help unstop this bottleneck we have started to support Sakina Denise as an outreach worker to new areas. Six new groups have been set up and survivors, orphans and widows ministered to. They include Bisesero where the men tried to defend the women and children but were tragically decimated over two months of constant struggle. Out of 50,000 people only 250 families were left. When the President visited the area he said "where will we get people to live on those hills again" It is our hope that partners will be found to help those people.

At Rukumberi 30,000 were killed and the survivors have had little help. The Rwanda 07 group went with Denise and Claire (a survivor from that area) to minister to them. Around 200 survivors warmly received us and we had a wonderful time of fellowship. They were obviously touched and encouraged by the interest and support shown. A gift of £8000 from the Rwanda 07 team has launched a partnership with this group to bring healing and support.

**HOPE IN CONGO**

Western Congo was once part of Rwanda and many of its people speak Kinyarwanda. Since 1992 Congo has experienced constant war and chaos with an estimated 3 million having died from war, famine and disease as a result. It is a tragic situation for a country with huge potential. We have felt for some time that what God has been doing in Rwanda can also benefit Congo and God has brought together some Congolese workers and our partners in Rwanda. In 1994 the area of Bukavu was one of the major areas affected by the Rwandan refugee crisis and it is still home to many refugees as well as suffering from interahamwe (militia) from Rwanda operating from their bases there. Comfort Rwanda has made a small grant of £500 as a start to provide some hope and help for those who are suffering in this area.
